he rear of the Kilroy's extended 1930's home is now adorned with a showstopping set of French doors, connecting the indoors and garden.

"We wanted the traditional, timeless look offered by French doors, as opposed to Bi-Fold doors"

ituated in a picturesque Cotswolds village, this stunning residence has undergone a sympathetic update of its feature sash windows.

"Old single glazed windows have been replaced like for like, an exact match," owners Mr & Mrs Goodfell describe.

Throughout this beautiful property, Slim sash windows were carefully chosen for the desired effect. These striking windows are hung on traditional cords and weights, finished in a colour complementary to Farrow & Ball "White Tie" and accompanied by brass hardware.

"The old windows were well maintained, and appeared ok on the surface, but the boxes were found to be rotten once removed."

With origins to the 1600s, and the reign of James I, the importance of the façade can't be understated in its prominent corner position within the village. The house continued to have significant development throughout the Georgian and Victorian eras leading to its present appearance, and is known to have served a number of purposes within the community.

"From our first contact visiting the Cheltenham showroom, the process has been first-rate. The surveyor's meticulous attention to detail was very impressive. The fitting team were simply excellent, working in some very challenging areas, among historic shutters and architrave, preserving them all perfectly."

ituated in an idyllic Essex town, this wonderful 1930s home has been extensively modernised and revitalised by the Connolley family.

"We purchased the house in 2020, a day prior to the first lockdown. It was listed via an open day with sealed bidding. The house had been empty for a couple of years prior and was really run down; we could see its potential and were delighted to secure it and move forward with the project" Mrs Connolley explains.

Despite having suffered from being abandoned, the property was full of original features and character that the Connolley's were keen to retain. They stripped the property back to modernise it, while keeping as many of these original features as possible.



Everyone from the team was a pleasure to deal with. We appreciated not being strong armed into a deal or sales pitch?

When describing the process of selecting their new windows supplier, Mrs Connolley comments, "we always wanted to have timber windows. We were speaking to multiple suppliers to compare, and some weren't open to timber and tried to steer us towards PVC, which we were not interested in".

Throughout the home, our flush casement windows in 'Off-White' were specified, with a classic glazing bar formation to the fanlights; a timeless, yet suitable change from the old leaded windows that were in place at the front of the home at the time of purchase.

In the dining room at the rear of the property a beautiful set of French doors, with flush casement flag windows provide a functional and stylish connection between home and garden, and complement the architecture of the home perfectly.

"Overall, we are very happy with how it has all turned out and are especially happy with the products!" the Connolley's conclude.

project including an oak framed and
stone extension.

Due to its location, the homeowners had plenty of things to consider, "this is a conservation village and is also within a national park meaning there were lots of restrictions and guidelines to follow, including providing samples of materials and colours we wanted to use."







Their choices were dual coloured Engineered Meranti Hardwood flush casement windows and a Chalfont front door, painted French Grey externally and Straw internally. Across the back of the house, sets of large pane French doors are finished in the same colour choices, and liberate the newly extended kitchen and family area.

"When we visited the showroom, we just had the feeling that this was right: the products and the service. We could tell it was a reputable company."


Mr MacMillan explains the approach they took to the project, "we've used quality products throughout the house: we could have gone for cheaper options in all areas, but we wanted to do this to the best level we possibly could, this included the windows and doors."

Making the house comfortable to live in was a priority, "we took a holistic approach to ensuring that the house was well insulated, and the windows and doors were a major contributor to the results we've achieved."

"It's been a real passion to carry out this project, and we're really very happy overall, including the windows and doors, as we feel they look right, and are sympathetic to the style of the property."

The terraced home of the Atkins family, on an appealing London street has received the ultimate boost to its outward appearance, thanks to a magnificent new door from Timber Windows.

"I was looking at potential companies to provide a replacement door, even before


we'd exchanged on the house" Mrs Atkins explains, such was her enthusiasm to replace the old PVC door, as soon as they moved in.

his 1902 detached house stands proud in the sought-after Long Ditton, Surrey close to the River Thames, Hampton Court Palace and Sandown Park racecourse.

The homeowner selected the Deco casement window for the substantial and challenging makeover of their home.

The Deco style features specially designed sections added to the front face of the window which allow the opening sashes to appear recessed within the frame. This important detail is common to properties of this period and was employed to provide a degree of modelling to the façade of urban homes.

Homeowner and part time project manager, Mrs Voysey, says "it was equally important to us that we retained the aesthetic quality in every detail. The windows are large and if the detailing is wrong it could have

had a disastrous impact."

The benefit of high-performance double glazing has added a new dimension to the family home overcoming heat loss, eliminating troublesome and unattractive condensation, and the need for unsightly secondary glazing. Situated on a residential road and in partial view of the main line rail serving the busy commuter link to Charing Cross, London, the new Deco casements have helped to reduce noise levels from entering the home.


For total privacy, attractive Etched Star glass was chosen for the large bathroom window.

Their local showroom provided expert guidance throughout the purchase and installation process, "the service was excellent from start to end and we were grateful for the technical support and advice we received," continues Mrs Voysey. "It took some time to agree the final order but that's because we asked for additional and bespoke work by Timber Windows."

his charming 1860s townhouse in an Essex city, is home to Mr Eldridge.

"It was crucial for me that any work on this house, was carried out properly and respected its history" Mr Eldridge outlines.

The presence of a nearby showroom and approachable team were key factors for the homeowner, "I like to interact with people when I'm making important purchases. I enjoyed seeing the range first-hand at the Colchester showroom, speaking with the team and dealing with a local company, that are experts in their craft."

"The old windows were of an unknown age, although we were certain they were fairly old, and had been repaired to keep them in working order over the years. Despite this, they were ultimately not proving to be very efficient" Mrs Porter describes.

The decision on retaining the old windows versus replacing was not an easy one for the homeowners, "we had to figure out our sense of duty to the past, however we were also conscious of a responsibility to better insulate the house and make it more efficient for years to come."





On the outskirts of a Surrey town, the late 1800s Arts & Crafts cottage of Mr and Mrs Parks proudly displays its new flush casement windows.

With a Grade II Listed status, based on being an important example of work by a prominent architect and its location, the property is strictly guarded, "Planning and conservation rules are very strictly applied to this house; we had to get permission to put a shed in the garden" Mr Parks explains.

"Previously the cottage had single glazed casement windows, likely the originals, however they were no longer fit for purpose, as they were ill-fitting and falling apart."





The conditions of changing the windows, as outlined by Mr Parks, were clearly set out, "the planning officers would allow double glazing, but only if it was very narrow and looked like single glazing. We were very impressed with the Timber Windows option for ultra-slim double-glazed units, as they satisfied the aesthetic requirements perfectly."



Mr & Mrs Lacey moved out of their Oxfordshire home, unchanged since the 1970s, while the whole house underwent a renovation.

'Changing from yellow pebble dash to a brick and render finish, gave us some tricky decisions to make on the colour of the windows and door, but ultimately we're very happy with how it has all turned out' Mrs Lacey describes.

The family chose a uniform finish of 'Calm Grey' across all the flush casement windows and Chalfont front door.

"We always felt that timber was the most appropriate and nicest material choice for this house."

LISTED

his exquisite West Sussex property, with previous Crown ownership dates to the 1300s, and some seven centuries later, is looking as good as ever, thanks to the care and attention taken by current owners, the Jeppesens.

Bought as a renovation project, this and another property in the grounds have been lovingly restored as select holiday homes.

"Our architect loves history and carried out lots of research; of particular interest to him are Listed properties" Mrs Jeppesen comments.

Cottage flush casement windows finished in 'White' featuring a mixture of I 4mm ultra slim double glazed units and 4mm single glazed units. All windows feature 22mm true bars, putty glazing and Polished Chrome Peardrop handles and pegstays.

"The windows shut tight, give no leaks and are much warmer."

Carrying out ground-up renovations, with the aid of their architect, the clients were able to put forward a strong case to the governing authority, for works to be carried out to the Grade II Listed structures.







"In the main house, the windows were derelict, the glass hanging out, broken and rotten throughout. They also had origins in the 1980s, meaning there was no historic integrity worth maintaining."



An online search led the owners to the Horndean showroom, "we were really impressed by the products and taken by how lovely they were."

"The conservation officers accepted the product, with double glazing permitted on all sides apart from the front façade, where single glazing was insisted upon."

The single glazed option from Timber Windows provides superior levels of insulation when compared to windows of old, and when combined with the double-glazing elsewhere in the property, has made for a much more comfortable cottage.

"The windows shut tight, give no leaks and are much warmer - they have also had a dramatic effect on the appearance of the house."

Chadlington entrance door finished in 'French Grey' with a Chrome Plated Ring knocker from Samuel Heath and a Polished Chrome Art Deco door knob and escutcheon. Manufactured in Engineered European Redwood.


COUNTRY HOME RESTORATION





Traditional wood is both beautiful and tactile. For many centuries it has been the material of choice for windows and doors throughout Britain and Europe. But traditional wood has innate problems - a natural tendency to expand and contract, and when wet, to warp in the direction of the grain resulting in windows and doors that twist and stick, causing frustration for homeowners.

Engineered, or multilayer timber, is an innovative solution that counteracts these issues. It is created by layering wood sections, with the grain of one section of wood layered in the opposing direction to the grain of its neighbour.

As wet wood has a tendency to warp in the direction of the grain, layering the wood in this way ensures that any movement caused by the absorption of moisture is evened out. So engineered timber is stronger, longer lasting and resistant to the issues that affect traditional wood. Windows and doors made with engineered timber retain their strength and structure, ensuring that they remain a perfect fit, just as they did on the day they were installed.

Using engineered timber ensures that there is no warping or twisting, sticking or rubbing, no matter how damp the prevailing atmospheric conditions. This makes it the perfect choice for every area of the UK - no matter how exposed the location.

Finished by hand

Engineered timber is also far easier to work with. It can be used to meet the design specifications of complex windows and doors much more efficiently than solid wood, yet retaining all of its natural appeal. And whilst state of the art computer controlled machinery inevitably plays its part, all of our engineered

10 reasons to choose timber windows

Factory applied micro-porous coatings providing maximum protection but minimal maintenance

All our windows and doors are factory painted prior to assembly, providing complete protection from moisture absorption and maximising longevity. Every product receives a base coat of timber preservative, then a primer coat, followed by two coats of micro-porous paint. You should expect our coatings to last up to 12 years for paint, and up to 6 years for stain, subject to care, maintenance and climatic conditions. Should you wish to change the colour of your windows, then redecoration is a simple task, as only light sanding is required followed by two coats of a good quality micro-porous paint or stain.

Glazing units almost twice as effective as ordinary

All of our windows and doors incorporate double-glazed units with enhanced thermally insulating glass, providing an extremely low U-value. We further improve the efficiency of the unit by filling the cavity with argon gas and using low conductivity spacer bars to minimise edge losses. The result is a 1.1 W/m2K centre pane U-value. This means an 80% increase in energy savings compared to single glazing, and a 45% increase in energy savings compared to ordinary double-glazing.

Internal beads for security

Glass is fitted from room side to prohibit would-be intruders from gaining entry by removing the glass.

Advanced glass technology not only provides enhanced thermal performance but also much improved clarity, particularly compared to traditional hard coated low e glasses. High light transmittance (77%) maximises the entry of natural light into the home.

Rebated glazing beads eliminate unsightly gaps between the frame and bead

In standard timber systems, paint is prone to cracking at the point where the bead meets the window frame. By rebating the glazing bead over the sash we conceal the joint, which eliminates the problem.

■n a popular North Yorkshire town, the remarkable 1850s home of the Swift family has been renovated and revitalised.

"Despite its imposing appearance and prominence, the house is not listed, meaning we were able to opt to replace failing single-glazed windows with double glazing" Mrs Swift explains.

home of character. The design and quality of the windows was a very important aspect of the overall build.




